Olivos. He received his bachelor's degree in chemistry from the California Institute of Technology in Pasadena, a master's degree in biology from UCSB, and a doctorate in environmental studies and engineering from UCLA.

Before coming to UCSB, he taught at Polytechnic School in Pasadena and Laguna Blanca School in Santa Barbara.

Dr. Schuyler served as president of the board of trustees of the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History and chairman of the board of the Santa Barbara Maritime Museum. He and his wife endowed a chair in environmental studies at UCSB, and he became a trustee of the UCSB Foundation in 2000.

Sailing was an important part of Dr. Schuyler's life, and he made more than 100 trips to the Santa Barbara Channel Islands, especially to San Miguel Island. His research interests were the hazards and risks of oil and marine operations in the

Santa Barbara Channel.

Dr. Schuyler is survived by his wife of 61 years, Jean K. Schuyler; four children, Ann (Paul Brenner), Peter (Lisa Stratton), Kate (Fred Sly), and John (Marianne); and seven grandchildren, Tristan Brenner, James Brenner, Dylan Schuyler, Jaime Schuyler, Patrick Wilcox, Sophie Schuyler, and Dorrien Schuyler.
